

What classes will my child have?

Students will have seven classes including:

- Elective Classes We strongly encourage students to take a music class.


*Placement in reading class is determined by previous academic progress and standardized test scores.

What about advanced academic classes?

Advanced class placement is based on:

- Standardized test scores
- Previous academic performance
- Teacher recommendation

These classes are designed to prepare your child for Advanced Placement courses at the high school.




Math Progression

22-23 Middle School Mathematics Course Progression

There are three main pathways students can take in mathematics in the middle grades (6-8). Although students are placed on these pathways as incoming 6th Grade students, they may be advised to move from one pathway to another based on academic performance.



Additional Notes

*Note: Incoming 6th graders scoring a level 3 on the prior year FSA Mathematics should be considered for placement in Accelerated Math, but additional data points should be taken into consideration such as: student interest in acceleration and prior course grades.

Intervention: Students scoring a Level 1 (low level 2) on the prior year FSA Mathematics should be enrolled in M/J Foundational Skills in Mathematics 6-8 (1204000) in addition to their core class to fill prior grade content gaps while also supporting grade-level instruction. This course can be blocked with core, but does not need to be. Note that this course does not count for a mathematics credit, but will count as an elective credit for students.

Acceleration: In two of the three pathways, students will learn content at an accelerated pace that includes the completion of one or more high school mathematics courses by the end of 8th grade. Final grades in high school courses taken in middle school will be credited to students' high school GPA. (Parent Flyer)

How do I request my child's electives?

You must complete the course selection form that will be given to your child's 5th grade teacher this Friday, February 2nd. We will be collecting the completed paper forms on Friday, February 9th. Make sure you discuss this as a family before completing the form and returning it.

You **MUST ALSO** access the Google Form link (found on the paper form or on our school website) for rising 6th graders under the Guidance Tab. Please make sure to request the electives in the order you want them. Electives are subject to change! The link will be available from February 2nd at 4:30 pm until February 9th at 4 pm. After that day, the link will be disabled and you will not be able to request your electives.

**You can only fill out the electronic form once, so before you fill it out, make sure you are certain about your selection.

How do I get my schedule?

Walkers, Bike Riders, and Car Riders:

- Car riders should be picked up and dropped off at the car loop in the designated area. Please stay in the loop and follow the flow of traffic. We will not allow students to walk across the parking lot or the street to meet you.
- Please maintain a safe speed while driving through the parking lot.
- Please refrain from cell phone use while in the car loop.
- All bikes must be locked in our bike rack.
- A helmet must be worn at all times while riding a bike, scooter or skateboard.

Transportation to and from School



Bus Transportation:

- Students who live more than two miles from the school are provided bus transportation.
- Students may <u>ONLY</u> ride the bus to which they are assigned, no exceptions.
- To locate your bus number, stop location, and pick up/drop off times, please visit the OCPS website and click on the Transportation Quick Link and then the "Find a Bus" link.
- Riding an OCPS bus is a privilege and students are expected to follow all rules and procedures/OCPS Code of Conduct to maintain this privilege.

OCPS Student Dress Code

The following dress expectation applies to all students in OCPS. Such as:

- Wearing pants at the waist
- Shorts and skirts must be at mid-thigh
- No bare midriffs
- No visible undergarments
- Clothing that is too tight or revealing is unacceptable. (Ex. leggings and jeggings)




